Festival of Hope 2005: Approaches to Wellness and Suicide Prevention

Festival of Hope 2005, sponsored by HeartLine, formerly known as CONTACT Crisis Helpline, and the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services will take place September 8, during National Suicide Prevention Week. This annual event seeks to increase awareness about the importance of physical, mental and spiritual wellness, and to increase awareness about suicide prevention.

The Festival of Hope 2005 Continuing Education Seminar is geared for professionals and open to the public, who will find both sessions informative and inspiring. The Reverend Leo Booth, an internationally acclaimed author, lecturer and trainer on all aspects of spirituality and recovery from depression, addictions, compulsive behaviors and low self-esteem, will touch your heart while imparting deep wisdom. This workshop will help you to reclaim a life with passion and aliveness.

Also presenting are Elsie and Gerald (Jerry) Weyrauch of Marietta, Georgia. The tragic death in 1987 of their daughter, Terri Ann, a doctor specializing in rheumatology, changed the direction of their lives. They have devoted themselves to work with fellow survivors to further suicide prevention in the United States. As part of their own grief recovery, they ran two survivor-of-suicide support groups in the Atlanta area for several years. During this time, they gained much collective experience of the needs of survivors and of running groups, which they attributed to the WHO book, "Preventing Suicide: How to start a Survivors Group," published in 2000.

Challenging Unhealthy Beliefs and Attitudes

PROGRAM PURPOSE

"The basic aim of recovery is to move away from unhealthy dependencies on things like drugs, sex, alcohol, food or gambling, and toward a powerful spiritual interdependence," says the Reverend Leo Booth, an internationally acclaimed author, lecturer and addictions counselor. "My basic definition of spirituality is a positive and creative human being. Taking care of your body, avoiding harmful behaviors and unhealthy relationships are spiritual acts."

The purpose of this lecture series is to realize that we already have precious "treasures" in our lives. The emphasis is to discover the gifts we have so that we can create success, health and prosperity.

Spirituality is the healthy relationship between body, mind and emotions. Booth also will explain the difference between spirituality and religion. He will discuss the ingredients of transformation and healing; discussing actions to be taken, boundary issues and utilization Education to sponsor continuing medical education of support groups and ongoing therapy.

- Understand Spirituality as a relationship between body, mind and emotions that determines the quality of our connection to others and the world around us.

Booth is a Unity minister, an internationally acclaimed author, lecturer and trainer on all aspects of spirituality and recovery from depression, addictions, compulsive behaviors and low self-esteem. A Certified Addiction Counselor, Certified Eating Disorders Counselor and NAADAC Approved Education Provider, Booth speaks at many national and international conferences, plus churches of all denominations. In addition to specific inservices and lectures on religious addiction and abuse. Booth presents workshops, lectures and training on a broad spectrum of issues to a variety of organizations and institutions. He contributes regularly to newspapers across the United States and is the author of 10 publications, including When God Becomes a Drug, The Wisdom of Letting Go, and Pearl in the Rice. He has appeared on The Oprah Winfrey Show, Geraldo, Sally Jesse Raphael and Good Morning America.

The Power of One: Putting Together the Suicide Prevention Puzzle

PROGRAM PURPOSE

This program will empower people to work the suicide prevention puzzle, and learn ways to contribute to suicide prevention in their own communities. Suicide claims approximately 30,000 lives per year nationally. Another 650,000 people receive emergency medical care annually after attempting suicide. Preventing suicide requires recognizing it as a preventable public health problem. This approach integrates suicide prevention into all facets of our society, including schools, workplaces, clinics, medical offices, correctional and detention centers, eldercare facilities, faith-based institutions and community centers. We must recognize its connection with mental illness, effectively diagnose and treat mental illness and provide supportive community environments that can give hope and help to atrisk persons. Suicide prevention is everyone's business.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the program, participants will be able to:

- 1. Restate suicide prevention's move since 1996 to a national and state public health problem;
- 2. Define the three pillars for translating public health policy into social practice;
- 3. Identify the elements of successful collaboration: key to effective suicide prevention:

- 5. State three ways individuals can contribute to suicide prevention locally.
