Three Stages of Healing: Recovery for the Survivors of Domestic Violence June 24, 2004, Tulsa; July 21, 2004, Oklahoma City; August 25, 2004, Idabel; and September 16, 2004, Woodward

Purpose

This workshop will prepare counseling staff to approach survivors of domestic abuse from a strength perspective. Counselors and assisting professionals will learn how to promote an identity of strength while helping clients deal with their traumatic abuse experiences. In addition, participants will learn more about the results of trauma from a psychological and physiological perspective and how to employ their knowledge in active work with their clients.

Dr. Judith Hermann's three stages of recovery will be used as a framework to view and treat survivors of domestic violence. Issues pertaining to safety and planning will be discussed as well as how to manage contextual variables such as court appearances. Processes and techniques to deal with remembering traumatic events and grieving the many losses associated with trauma will be shared. A model for a mentoring program will be presented to assist with this process. The role of the counselor will be discussed as well.

Objectives

Upon completion of the program, the participant shall be able to:

- 1. Describe how to approach survivors from a strength perspective;
- 2. Identify psychological and physiological effects of trauma;
- 3. Develop ways to enhance a sense of safety;
- 4. List the three stages of healing and suggest treatment intervention at each stage; and
- 5. Explain how to enhance survivor's recovery by utilizing a variety of trauma techniques, including CBT, EMDR, CISM, relaxation, and other interventions.
