# The Evidence Based Treatment of Anxiety and Depression: Symptoms and Disorders in Early Recovery Friday, August 13, 2004

# **Program Purpose**

Many alcoholics and addicts in early recovery exhibit symptoms of depression and anxiety. If these symptoms are severe enough they may be diagnosed as Co-occurring Affective or Anxiety Disorders. In some instances, the depression and anxiety symptoms do not qualify as a psychiatric disorder but can be a part of a relapse dynamic. In order to aid in the alcoholics and addicts recovery, these issues must be treated.

The field of Behavioral Medicine is robust with new data and research that needs to be translated into useful information for the benefit of the front-line clinician. The ultimate goal of this translation is to empower the clinician with the best information and technique available.

This skills training event will give clinicians the latest research on the interface between Substance-Related Disorders and Axis I Anxiety and Affective Disorders. The training will also look at symptoms of anxiety and depression (not severe enough to meet DSM IV criteria) that may precipitate relapse.

Participants can expect to learn how this research translates into actual work with clients. Empirically based psychotherapeutic and pharmacological interventions will be the focus of this skills training event. Case vignettes will be utilized to demonstrate practical application of clinical technique.

# **Faculty**

An internationally recognized expert in areas of behavioral medicine and addictions treatment, Cardwell C. Nuckols, MA, Ph.D., has been a clinical and developmental consultant for over thirty years. He has been awarded national honors including the SECAD and Gooderham awards, as well as, being recognized for his contributions to The American Society of Addiction Medicine's Patient Placement Criteria. Dr. Nuckols' passion and mission is to assist in the translation of emerging scientific research into information and techniques helpful to those who do the important work of helping alcoholics, addicts and those suffering from co-occurring disorders.

Dr. Nuckols is widely published, having authored more than 50 journal articles, 28 books and workbooks, 24 DVDs, CDs and videos, and 17 audiotape series. Dr Nuckols first book, Cocaine: Dependency to Recovery, is a trade best seller, as are his booklets Quitting Heroin and Quitting Marijuana (Hazelden). His recent works include the book, Healing an Angry Heart (HCI) and video Chalk Talk on Drugs with Father Martin (Kelly Productions).

- 4. List at least two psychotherapeutic and/or pharmacological techniques empirically proven to be effective in the treatment of Substance-Related Disorders and Affective Disorders (Examples-Major Depressive and Bipolar Disorders.
- 5. Describe psychotherapeutic and/or pharmacological techniques empirically proven to be effective in the treatment of Substance-Related Disorders and Anxiety Disorders. (Examples: Social Anxiety and PTSD)
- 6. Discuss the use of cognitive, behavioral and interpersonal strategies useful in treating symptoms and disorders.
