Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault Provider Training Preferences: May 2002

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BACKGROUND

In May 2002, the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (DMHSAS) initiated a survey to assess the training preferences of staff employed by Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault Service agencies. The purpose of the survey was to develop training programs that would help staff of the provider agencies deliver quality services to Oklahomans in need.

The questionnaire design was a cooperative effort between the Deputy Commissioner for Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Services, the DMHSAS Institute for Mental Health and Substance Abuse Training and Education, and the Decision Support Services.

Domestic Violence Training Preference survey questionnaires were deployed by mail to 164 employees and volunteers at DMHSAS-funded domestic violence/sexual assault provider agencies. With 70 completed surveys returned, the response rate was 43 percent. At the 95 percent confidence level, the confidence interval (estimated frequency error) is +/- 8.9.

Based on counts of self-reported administrators and directors, approximately 20 provider agencies are represented in the survey sample.

The DMHSAS Institute for Mental Health and Substance Abuse Training will use the survey results to develop quality training programs tailored to the specific needs of the Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault service providers.

RESPONDENT HIGHLIGHTS

The median educational level of the survey respondents was bachelor's degree. The minimum was G.E.D., while the maximum was the Master's degree level.

More than half the respondents (51%) had been working in their current field for five or fewer years.

Approximately three of every five respondents (57.7%) had their CDSVRP certification. Nearly one out of five (19.2%) respondents possessed LPC or LMFT licenses.

Nearly nine of every ten respondents worked primarily in Crisis Centers (34.3%) or Shelters (52.9%). A handful of respondents worked primarily in schools, chemical dependency treatment/support settings, hotlines, or office settings.

While respondents reported they interacted with many different entities outside their own organization, they were most likely to interact with the county sheriff (71%), followed by the Department of Human Services (64.2%), and substance abuse entities (62.7%).

Only 91 percent of the respondents reported serving women. The remaining respondents reported serving batterers, children and teens.


